Dear Representative Johnson:

In accordance with the reporting requirements contained in Section 5124 of the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)/Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Reauthorization Act of 2011 (Reauthorization Act), I am pleased to submit to you on behalf of the SBIR/STTR Interagency Policy Committee (IPC) the attached five (5) reports to Congress:

- 1) *Outreach*;
- 2) *Commercialization*;
- 3) *Award Size Flexibility*;
- 4) *TechNet Public & Government Databases*; and,
- 5) *Standard Evaluation Framework*.

The Reauthorization Act created the IPC, which is co-chaired by the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and comprised of representatives from each Federal agency that participates in the SBIR/STTR programs. SBA, OSTP and the agency representatives have collaborated through the IPC to achieve numerous accomplishments toward improving administrative programmatic efficiencies while spurring innovative small business research and research development.
